

Province Funding Infrastructure in North Western Ontario*Projects Approved under the Canada-Ontario Small Communities Fund*

Residents of Whitesand First Nation and Nigigoonsiminikaaning First Nation will benefit from important infrastructure projects thanks to joint funding from the governments of Ontario and Canada through the Small Communities Fund.

The project in Whitesand will involve extending the existing water distribution system from the First Nation to the Township of Armstrong's water main. Once completed, the new connection will help provide safe, clean, high-quality drinking water for local residents.

The Nigigoonsiminikaaning project will include improvements to the storm water management and drainage systems and the redevelopment of an emergency access road surrounding water crossings. This will help control water movement and ensure safe access to the Nigigoonsiminikaaning First Nation community during emergencies.

The Small Communities Fund provides funding for priority public infrastructure projects that deliver on local needs. Through the program, Ontario and Canada are each providing \$272 million to support projects in communities across the province with fewer than 100,000 residents. This funding will help address local priorities, support job creation and economic growth, and help local residents to sustain a high quality of life for years to come.

Investing in local communities is part of the government's plan to build Ontario up. The four-part plan includes investing in people's talents and skills, making the largest investment in public infrastructure in Ontario's history, creating a dynamic, innovative environment where business thrives, and building a secure retirement savings plan.
